

JUST OUTSIDE OF TOWN

EARTHQUAKE LAKE VISITOR'S CENTER

The center provides a panoramic view of the "mountain that fell" and the lake that was formed. Located 27 miles from West Yellowstone on US Highway 287. 406-682-7620

REFUGE POINT HIKING TRAIL

A 2.5 mile loop trail located on Highway 287 between Hebgen and Earthquake lake.

WEST YELLOWSTONE RODEO & TRAIL RIDES

Rodeo Events, One-hour Trail Rides, and half-hour Wagon Rides. Located 7 miles from West Yellowstone just off Highway 20. 406-560-6913 westyellowstonerodeo.com

A LITTLE FARTHER FROM TOWN

BIG SPRINGS & JOHNNY SACK CABIN

Big Springs is one of the 40 largest natural springs in the world, producing over 120 million gallons of water a day. Adjacent to the springs is Johnny Sack Cabin, a historic handcrafted log and stone cabin featuring wood furnishings and artifacts. Located 28 miles from West Yellowstone on Big Springs Loop Road.

MESA FALLS

Drive the Mesa Falls Scenic Byway and take a short hike to the Upper and Lower Falls. The Scenic Byway starts approximately 37 miles from West Yellowstone on US Highway 20.

HARRIMAN STATE PARK

A 16,000 acre wildlife refuge known for its beautiful scenery and wildlife, with 22 miles of hiking, mountain biking, and horseback riding trails. Located 38 miles from West Yellowstone on US Highway 20.

RIVER RAFTING

Go rafting on the Gallatin River near Big Sky with Montana Whitewater or Geyser Whitewater Expeditions.

OUSEL FALLS HIKING TRAIL

Ousel Falls is a short but stunning hike in the heart of Big Sky.

BIG SKY RESORT

More than just a ski resort, offering tram rides to the top of Lone Peak, downhill mountain biking, hiking and more.

YELLOWSTONE PLAYHOUSE

Dinner theatre with family friendly musical spoofs. This year's shows include Ramona's Home School Musical, Phantom of the Grand Old Opry, and Idaho Jones and the Quest for the Yellow-Stone.

VIRGINIA CITY & NEVADA CITY

Visit the historic Montana Territorial Capital and Nevada City Ghost Town. Ride the train on the Alder Gulch Shortline Railroad, pan for gold, and visit the Museum & Music Hall.

MUSEUM OF THE ROCKIES

A Smithsonian Affiliate renowned for its extensive collection of dinosaur fossils.

LEWIS AND CLARK CAVERNS

Hike and experience amazing geologic wonders at Montana's first and best-known state park, showcasing one of the most highly decorated limestone caverns in the Northwest.
